

BIG PLANS FOR FORT CLARENCE BEACH PARK

Guardsman Hospitality has major plans for a multi-million dollar transformation of the Fort Clarence Beach Park. The popular spot for sea-bathing and seafood will be completely redesigned to include an amphitheatre for major performance events, ship-themed water park, play area and art walk, main deck with swimming pool and upgraded beachfront with food concession booths and Gift Shop. The beachfront will also be protected with a seawall and a floating deck is to be constructed to allow private vessels access from the sea.

Guardsman Hospitality General Manager, Laura Heron, shared the plans at the February 18 meeting of the AHLC Community Representatives. Ms Heron disclosed that the current plans will cost an estimated US\$8 million to execute, with financing currently being sourced. She noted that the project could be completed within 8 months if

financed, but would take several years if the company does it alone.



The Fort Clarence Beach Park was re-opened after the COVID-19 lockdown at a cost of J\$20 million, with ongoing clearing of sargassum seaweed a major cost. They are currently open to the public Wednesdays to Fridays with a \$1000 admission fee. Residents in the Hellshire area are encouraged to develop skillsets geared toward hospitality & submit applications, as the company needs suitable staff for the planned expansion and wants to support the local economy.



Pictures shared by Guardsman Hospitality show the Master Plan, proposed Water Park, Main Deck with swimming pool and kids play area & Art Walk sections. The development will elevate the community and property values and stimulate investment in the area with increased patronage.

The official launch of the Neighbourhood Watch Programme for Hellshire Park Estate, Seaforth and Fort Hill and AHLC security camera system will be on March 25 at the Hellshire Park Shopping Centre.


POLICE GIVE ROAD SAFETY REMINDERS

Motorists in the Hellshire community are being reminded to educate themselves on the new Road Traffic Act and the adjusted penalties for breaches.

Corporal Althea Nevins of the Hellshire Police Post says speeding is of particular concern. "The continuous speeding in the communities has become a habit. Motorists are to be mindful that the road surfaces are not for speeding and therefore can cause accidents." The proper use of roundabouts is another key issue. "Persons exiting Johnson Hill are not allowing those already in the roundabout to make their way in the direction they are going. This can cause serious accidents," notes Corp. Nevins.

Sections regarded as 'Hot Spots' include: Fort Clarence roundabout, Hellshire Road bridge and the corner leading to the Fort Clarence roundabout. Two vehicles ran off the road on the Hellshire Road on March 1 & 2.

The police advise that motorists are to ensure that their motor vehicles are road worthy and fit for safe driving.



AHLC WORKING FOR YOU

Lobbying efforts by the AHLC on behalf of the residents of Windcrest Hills regarding the lack of piped water to that community produced a date for connection. Intervention by Mayor Leon Thomas to the NHT saw the NWC advise that water supply will be connected after the distribution system is sterilized by the NHT. The agencies have committed to a mid-March 2023 date for this to be completed. The AHLC will be following up.
