The police want to also make it clear that the recent dumping of a body in the swamp near the Fort Clarence Roundabout on the Hellshire Main Road was a crime external to the Hellshire area, but the use of increased patrols and spot checks will be used to deter such activities. The incident caused delays as the road was closed during the search for a suspect and processing of the scene. A strong contingent of police carried out the June 8 operation.
