COASTAL CLEANUP DAY AT SANDHILLS DIP BEACH ____

An enthusiastic group of volunteers turned out for International Coastal Cleanup Day on September 16 at the Dip Beach off the Sandhills Main Road.

On a very warm Saturday morning, the crew collected 66 bags of plastic bottles - approximately 8000 bottles removed from a 200m section of the coastline. Additionally, 3 bags of glass bottles weighing about 68kg (150lbs), 3 bags of shoes, 1 bag of foam and paper material plus a pile of plastic material including fridge and cooler pieces and two large piles of driftwood were also collected.

Participants worked for over three hours, with visible results and a greater understanding of the need for recycling and less single-use plastic products in particular.

The cleanup was coordinated by the AHLC Environmental Committee, with plans to do regular cleanup activities to help reduce the amount of ocean-bound plastics.
